A NOTE FROM FR. JOE

Dear Parishioners:

While I served as the Pastor of St. Joseph, I took the occasion each December to share with you an Annual Report about the sacramental statistics and finances of our parish community. While sharing our financial information is a requirement of the Diocese of Cleveland, each parish is free to share the required information as it feels best suited for the parish. I always thought it best not only to share the numbers, but also to share the statistics that relate the life of our parish. It is easy to share the financial figures and the parish life statistics, but even these do not begin to account for the countless numbers of ministries, volunteers, ministers, and activities of the parish. St. Joseph is a parish that is very much alive and well...

Writing to you a final time in this format, I begin with a deep appreciation and gratitude for the time that we shared over the past 12 years. One of my greatest blessing remains the privilege and the honor that I have had to call myself the Pastor of St. Joseph. I could only be pastor because of you as without people, there is no one to pastor! I am grateful for you, your support, and all your efforts over these years. I pray that, as you have supported me and enabled us to accomplish so much together, that you will offer the similar or better support to Fr. Andy Gonzalez as he begins his ministry in January.

With a deep sense of gratitude for your commitment to the parish, I present to you our Annual Report covering various aspects of our parish community from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.

First and foremost, I draw your attention that this was another year that ended with a surplus, which help save for the future. *Thank you!* The Finance Council and I have labored to use a more "conservative" approach to the budget, so you will notice that the overall budget for next year looks closer to the year ending June 30, 2022 rather than the fiscal year that was just concluded.

Beyond this, the Finance Council and I thought it an opportune time to illustrate how positive our parish's financial position has been throughout our time together. We did this by illustrating the last two year's of assets and liabilities in comparison to the year ending June 30, 2011. You will notice this on the "Statement of Church Assets, Liabilities, and Fund Balance" sheet. Over the past 12 years with your support and deliberate planning we were able to reduce

our debt from nearly \$579,000 to \$0, increase our cash reserves by nearly \$327,300, add new ministries, and complete necessary maintenance and other improvements. This reflects over \$906,000 of positive cash flow and improved ministries and facilities that will serve us well now and into the future. I have tried to recount many of these later in this report. Because we were able to address these items, we remain confident that we still do not anticipate any major capital repairs through the end of this decade.
